
Repression

- Irrespective of time or geography, repression is a constant in human relations, leading to segregation by class, caste
- Currency that the few have used to contain the curiosity and entrepreneurial energy of the majorities
- Takes a wide array of forms, from the physical, concrete (bondage, incarceration) to the subtle, intangible (omission, deceitfulness)





Cellphones as Liberators




- The advent of the mobile phone is an event of socio-economic significance beyond anyone's expectation.

 Demand to hear and be heard at the bottom of the pyramid is the single greatest pent-up market force to come into the industry during the last ten years












Connect and Be Connected at BOP


